## NURSE'S CORNER

Welcome to a new school year! As the school nurse, my goal is to help keep all students healthy, safe, and ready to learn. Please take a moment to review these important reminders as we start the year:

- If your child requires medication at school (including inhalers, EpiPens, or daily prescriptions), please be sure all necessary forms are completed and medications are brought to the nurse's office in their original containers. Make sure medical forms are completed and updated if there were any medication changes or changes to the medication regimen over the summer.
- Please ensure that I am aware of any allergies your child may have
- To help keep everyone healthy, please keep your child home if they have a fever (100.4°F or higher), vomiting, diarrhea, or any contagious symptoms. They should be fever-free for 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school.
- If your child suffered any injuries during the summer that will impact their mobility, please send in a doctor's note and call me.
- Please ensure that all emergency contact information is current and that listed individuals are available during school hours in case your child becomes ill or injured.
- Schedule your child's yearly physical so they are up-to-date, especially if your child plans on playing any team sports during the school year.



